

Kathy Charmaz 2-day workshop 'Constructing grounded theory'



What: In this 2-day workshop you will be introduced to the basics of Kathy Charmaz's version of grounded theory. She will tell us about the history of grounded theory, and how she has developed her approach. Also, she will introduce grounded theory interviewing and coding techniques, and give small exercises, through which we become familiar with coding and writing memos. Detailed program will be sent to participants as soon as Kathy has developed it.

About Kathy Charmaz: Kathy is professor emerita at Sonoma University, California. She is the author of the book *Constructing Grounded Theory*, which is widely used in qualitative research and teaching qualitative methods, including at Political Science I Aarhus.
